THE UCAS

The UCAS is the unified portal for UK university applications, allowing up to **five course choices**, all under one application. Admissions tutors assess your academic record and your passion, resilience, and potential via your personal statement and reference.

Timeline & Key Dates

2 Sep	Applications open & can be started. You can't submit before this date.
15 Oct	Deadline for Oxbridge and Medicine/Dentistry/Vet Med applications (6pm UK time). Equal consideration cutoff.
14 Jan	(6pm) Equal consideration deadlines for most other courses.
26 Feb – 30 Jun	UCAS Extra available for applicants not holding offers.
30 Jun	Final date to submit applications. After 6pm UK time, late applications enter Clearing.
Reply deadlines vary by when decisions arrive	Around May–July based on last decision received.

Course Choice Guide

- **Up to five choices total** – any combination across universities or within one. No preference order is shown to universities.
- **Medicine/Dentistry/Vet med** applicants may choose **max four choices**, leaving the fifth slot for a related subject.
- **Applying to multiple courses at the same university** is permitted, but only effective when courses are closely related. Using two choices on highly similar courses is often redundant.
- **Personal Statement remains singular** – sent to all five choices. You cannot write multiple statements.
- **Oxbridge rule:** Only **one course per cycle** and you can't apply to both Oxford and Cambridge unless specific graduate exceptions apply.



UCAS Application Guide

- **Personal Details:** Ensure legal name (passport-style), and use a frequently checked email.
- **Course Choices:** Strategically align choices: include dream, realistic, and 'backup' options.
- **Education History:** List all qualifications, predicted grades, and exam boards accurately. Include resits where relevant.
- **Employment Section:** Only paid jobs are listed here — keep volunteer experience for your statement.
- **Personal Statement:** Structured into three UCAS prompts.
- **Reference:** Your referee should know your subject choices and strengths — especially for competitive applications.



The 2026 Personal Statement (3 Prompts)

- **Minimum 350 characters** per section; **max 4,000 characters total** across all.
- **PS strategy:** Begin with a vivid anecdote or insight — avoid clichés like “I’ve always loved...”.

Prompt 1 — Why do you want to study this course?

- Explain a specific moment, book, lecture, or topic that sparked your interest.
- Oxbridge tip: mention independent reading beyond the curriculum.

Prompt 2 — How have your qualifications prepared you?

- Explore your A-levels, EPQ, coursework, MOOCs, or projects that deepened your subject knowledge.
- For Medicine/Vet/Dentistry: cite lab work, science projects, or academic achievements.

Prompt 3 — What extra-curricular preparation have you done and why?

- Reflect on relevant volunteering, leadership roles, competitions, MOOCs, or shadowing.
- Highlight transferable skills: empathy, analysis, time management.



Oxbridge & Competitive Course Strategies

Applicants	What to Work On
Oxbridge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only one course; choose college or opt for 'open'. Research college cultures and subject strengths. • Admissions tests: TSA, MAT, BMAT, LNAT, etc. • Practice with timed past papers. • Interviews: Academic, conversational, and reasoning-focused. Practice 'thinking aloud' to mirror tutorial-style questioning.
Medicine/Vet/Dentistry	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test requirements: UCAT or GAMSAT. • Clinical experience is essential — include shadowing, volunteering, or healthcare-related MOOCs. • Interviews: Expect Multiple Mini Interviews (MMIs) with ethical scenarios and patient-focused questions.

Expert Insights on Course & University Selection

- **Multiple courses at one university:** Acceptable if subjects are closely related. Avoid wasting two choices on almost identical options.
- **Fifth choice tip for clinical applicants:** Use it for a related subject as an insurance plan.
- **Diversified interests?** If your course choices are very different, emphasise transferable skills in your personal statement. Some universities may accept a separate statement if arranged directly.



Final Review & Submission Checklist

- Note all key deadlines; submit 1–2 weeks early
- Five choices effectively allocated (reach/match/insurance)
- Personal statement draft meets prompts and includes vivid examples
- Reference requested early and tailored to course specifics
- Registered and practiced for admissions tests if required
- Mock interviews arranged for Oxbridge or clinical applicants
- Final proofreading: no typos or grammar errors
- Fee paid (£28.95 for up to five choices for 2026 entry)



Frequently Asked Questions

FQ: Can I apply to completely different subjects (like Physics and History)?

A: Yes, but your personal statement must bridge those subjects via skills and themes. Most advisors recommend focusing on a related subject set.

Q: Should I use two choices on the same department (e.g. Law and Juriprudence)?

A: It can be effective, but many universities won't issue multiple offers from the same institution.

Q: What if I exceed my firm choice conditions?

A: The previous "Adjustment" scheme has been discontinued. Any change requires reapplication or use of Clearing.
